From Our Minister:

When I was new to teaching (my previous career) I would agonize over what my students would forget during their Summer Vacation. In the months before summer I found myself drilling them with facts in the hope that the long sought after multiplication tables or phonetic spelling would become cemented in their brains. And on the last day of school I would send them home with elaborate practice packets.

After about three years of teaching I realized that no matter how hard I or my students would work, there would always be regression. And this started me thinking about the risks and benefits of summer vacation.

What good is a summer vacation anyway? We no longer need to help our families gather the harvest, so what possible benefit could a summer vacation have? After a short time of observation I realized that although my students returned each year having forgotten a few academic details they were significantly changed in other ways. Each year seemed to mark growth in maturity and character that I might not have noticed if we had never taken the break. Most importantly students and teachers after the summer break always returned in the fall refreshed and ready to begin anew.

Quite surprisingly I found that our time apart always seemed to make us grow closer together. Teaching the five days per week in a self contained classroom for six hours a day made us very close, but it also gave us very little time to miss each other. Summer vacation helped us to remember what we liked about each other by pointing out what we missed and giving us energy to begin again.

As we begin our reduced Summer Schedule at First Church and Parish it would be normal to worry about what might be lost. We have worked hard and accomplished a great deal this year. We have been on the verge of growth and yet there is still much to be done if we are to accomplish all of our dreams and the temptation is to keep on going.

Taking time to rest and recreate and cogitate might seem frivolous in such times but I am pretty sure taking a time off is exactly what is necessary to make things grow. I hope as you plan your summer you set aside a string of days when you are free of anything more than enjoying the season. And if you love to worship that you join us for our abbreviated summer services with no expectation greater than to enliven your mind and lift your spirits.

Most importantly I hope that all of our summers are full of surprises with plenty of room to relax and recreate giving us time to remember what we like about First Church and Parish and giving us energy and new ideas to begin again full force in the fall. May we all return to Church on Homecoming Sunday relaxed and ready to start anew!

Minutes of the Parish Committee Meeting May 13, 2008

Meeting called to order by Diane Winchester at 7:05 pm. The meeting began with opening words by Langston Hughes and a moment of silence.

Minutes of April 8 and April 14, 2008 meetings - motion to approve as presented by Sam King, second - passed.

Minister's Report

The minister's report was submitted orally and in writing. Rali reported that today was the first anniversary of being called to the ministry at First Church and Parish in Dedham. She relayed that Music Sunday will be in the Parish House and some summer services are planned, beginning on June 15th. Memorial services were held for Fran Grilley and Jake Wiren, Rali thanked Linnea and the choir for participating in these services. Rali will be attending the Festival of Homiletics, May 19th -23rd.

Treasurer's Report

The treasurer's report was submitted in oral and written form by Dan Ewing. **Motion to accept as presented by Sam King, second - passed.**

Religious Education

Carol Dixon reported that the RE Committee met to configure classes for next year and to plan next year's curriculum. Children's Sunday will be on June 1st, the theme is "Green Ideas and How We Take Care of Our Earth". The committee has received one new resume for the DRE position.

By Law Committee

The By Law Committee will continue their review over the next year.

Behavioral Covenant

The Behavioral Covenant committee has been formed and is in process.

Annual Meeting Preparation Stewardship Committee

Dan Ewing reported that \$98, 350 in pledges had been received at this time. With this amount of income we are able to fund the DRE at \$15, 500 and restore some janitorial services. He added that we had the potential of \$6000 more in pledges based on last year's figures. 50% of this figure was added to the proposed budgets for raises for our current employees and to partially restore the youth leader position. The committee discussed funding committees with any extra incoming funds.

Motion to accept the FY 2009 budget as proposed, by Sam King, second - passed.

Nominating Committee

Jeff Hutton presented a partial slate of officers that will be finalized before the Annual Meeting on May 18, 2008.
