The Connecticut Department of Children and Families is clearly a broken system and I feel an urge to push for laws that will make the system accountable to children while I feel an equal draw to return to Dedham where I know things aren't as dysfunctional.

No matter what happens on this end, I will be in the pulpit every Sunday in September and will be back full time in October.

I am grateful for all the love and support I have received as we have tried to make Lemonade out of some very sour lemons.

Coffee Hour Pilot Project Update

A Pilot Project is underway to help create a network of people to provide all of the necessary pieces to this special and “sacred” time in the life of the congregation. The model is based off of one that several other UU congregations around our association have been using to lighten the load and create opportunities to meet and get to know others. The framework involves groups of 8 to 10 people with a team leader, these folks then break up the tasks involved in coffee hour: setting up tables and chairs, providing light food/snacks, cleaning up kitchen and returning the tables and chairs back against the walls at the end. Essentially, First Church is large enough to support 8 teams so every team only serves once every 8 weeks.
