Available roles for 2014/15
Spirit Play, Prek-K : Montessori-based curriculum with a wide range of stories on UU sources and principles. Teachers present the week's story with manipulative materials and "wonder" about them with the children, followed by a child-centered time of art, yoga or other choices. (Fall and Spring, teacher orientation in September)
Wonderful Welcome: 1st Grade : From the UUA's online curricula "Tapestry of Faith," this class explores the idea of welcoming, and the intangible gifts we use when we welcome, such as Love, Forgiveness, Helping, Celebration. Each gift is introduced through an object, such as a "golden ruler," to help illustrate the week's theme.
Timeless Themes: Grades 2-4: Stories from the Hebrew and Christian bibles provide a platform for questions of right and wrong. Through storytelling, drama, craft activities and a lot of laughter, this class
Sing to the Power: Grades 5-6: affirms our Unitarian Universalist heritage of confronting "powers and structures of evil with justice, compassion, and the transforming power of love." Participants experience their own power, and understand how it can help them to be leaders.
Teaching roles are filled for: OWL grades 5-6 (Fall) Neighboring Faiths, grades 7-8 (Fall) OWL grades 7-8 (Spring)
* For the safety and well-being of our children, you must have been attending First Church for at least one semester to be eligible to teach. At no time will an adult be permitted to be alone with a child not their own. All classroom teachers will sign a standard Ethical Behavior Agreement and whenever possible are paired with at least one other adult. Please speak with the DRE if you have questions or concerns.
